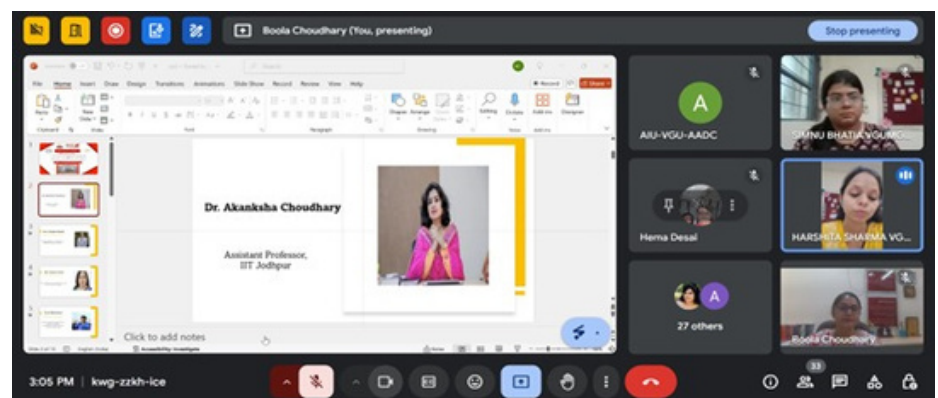
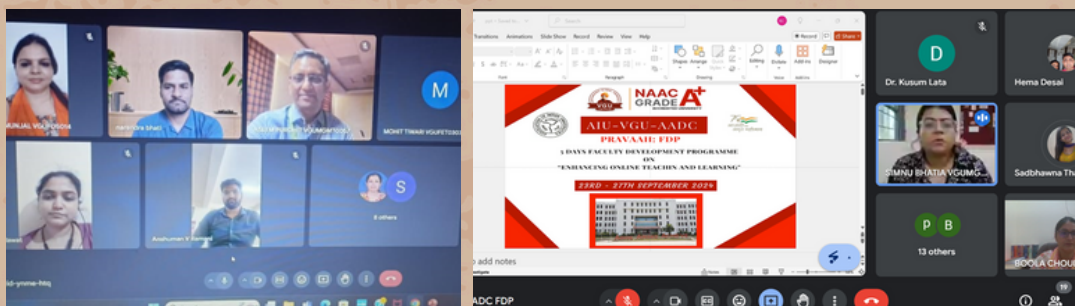
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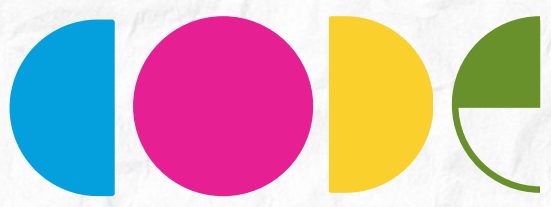
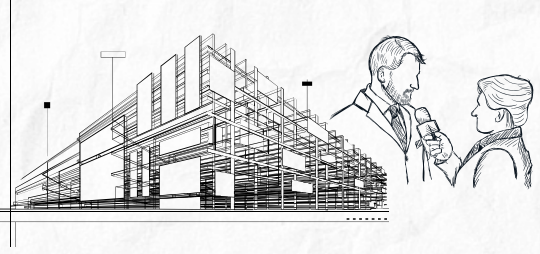


6-DAY FDP ON RESEARCH METHODS: ECONOMETRICS USING SPSS & EIEWS AT VGU

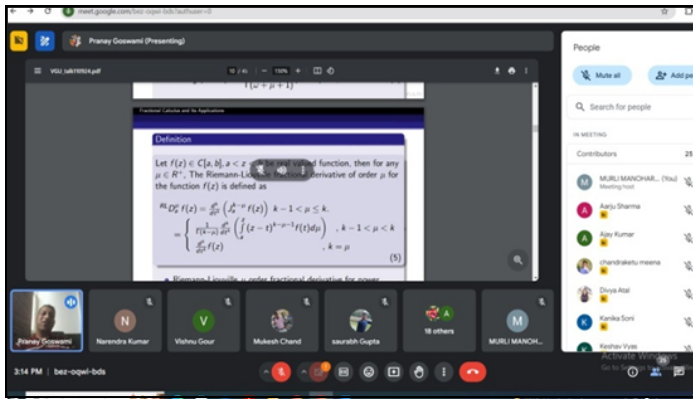
WEBINAR ON INTERNATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES FOR PHARMACISTS
